

An invitation to join the **Massachusetts Orchid Society**

The Massachusetts Orchid Society is a nonprofit educational organization of individuals from all walks of life, who share an interest in orchids. These interests range from the simple appreciation of orchids as beautiful flowers to highly technical involvement in orchid breeding and taxonomy. Most MOS members are active orchid growers, growing their own plants under conditions ranging from window sill or artificial light gardens to highly automated greenhouses.

The MOS holds monthly meetings throughout the year, encompassing a broad range of topics. The program for a typical meeting includes a presentation by a guest speaker, an orchid show table, sales tables and free orchid raffles. Meetings are held at the University of Massachusetts Suburban Experimental Station (Waltham Field Station), 241 Beaver Street (behind Bentley College), Waltham, generally on the second Tuesday of every month, at 7:30. There is an orchid library available to members, featuring videos as well as books.

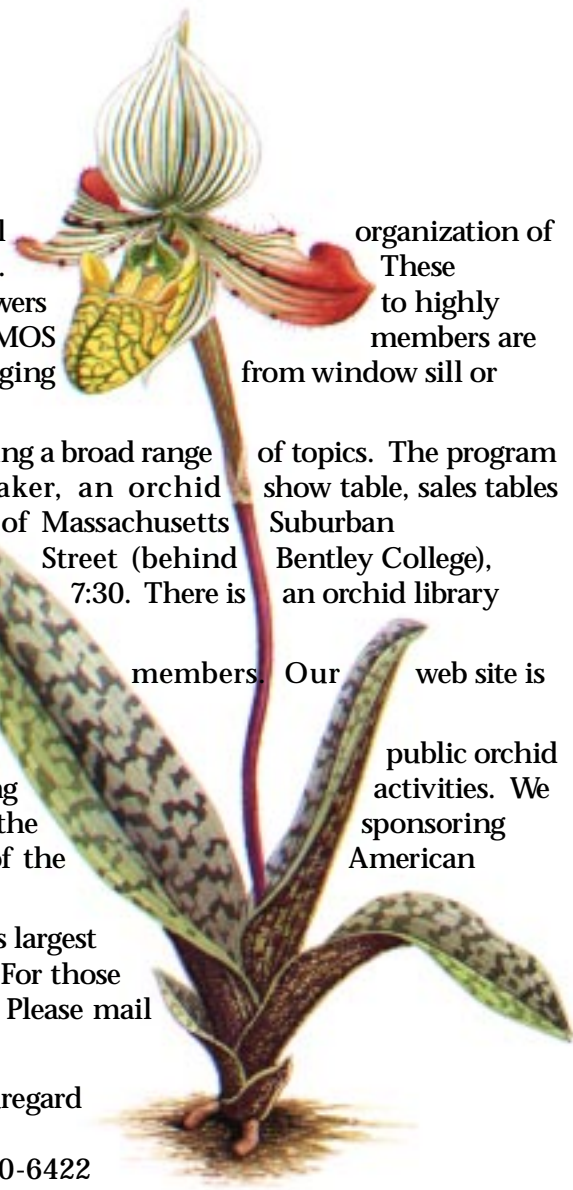
The Society publishes a monthly newsletter, which is sent to all members. Our web site is located at <http://www.massorchid.org/>

Directions to the University of Massachusetts Suburban Experimental Station:

From I-95 (Rt 128) take Route 20 (Exit 26 Main St.) east. Bear left on Route 60 (Waverly Oaks Road), then turn left on Beaver Street. The Field Station is approximately 1/8 mile on the left.

or

From I-95 take Totten Pond Road (Exit 27A) East (right at lights) for 1.2 miles. At lights turn right onto Lexington St. At next lights (1/4 mile) turn left onto Beaver St. Go through rotary. Field Station is approximately 1 mile on the right.

From downtown Boston, take Route 20 (Main St.) west. Turn right on Route 60 (Waverly Oaks Road), then turn left on Beaver Street. The Field Station is approximately 1/8 mile on the left.

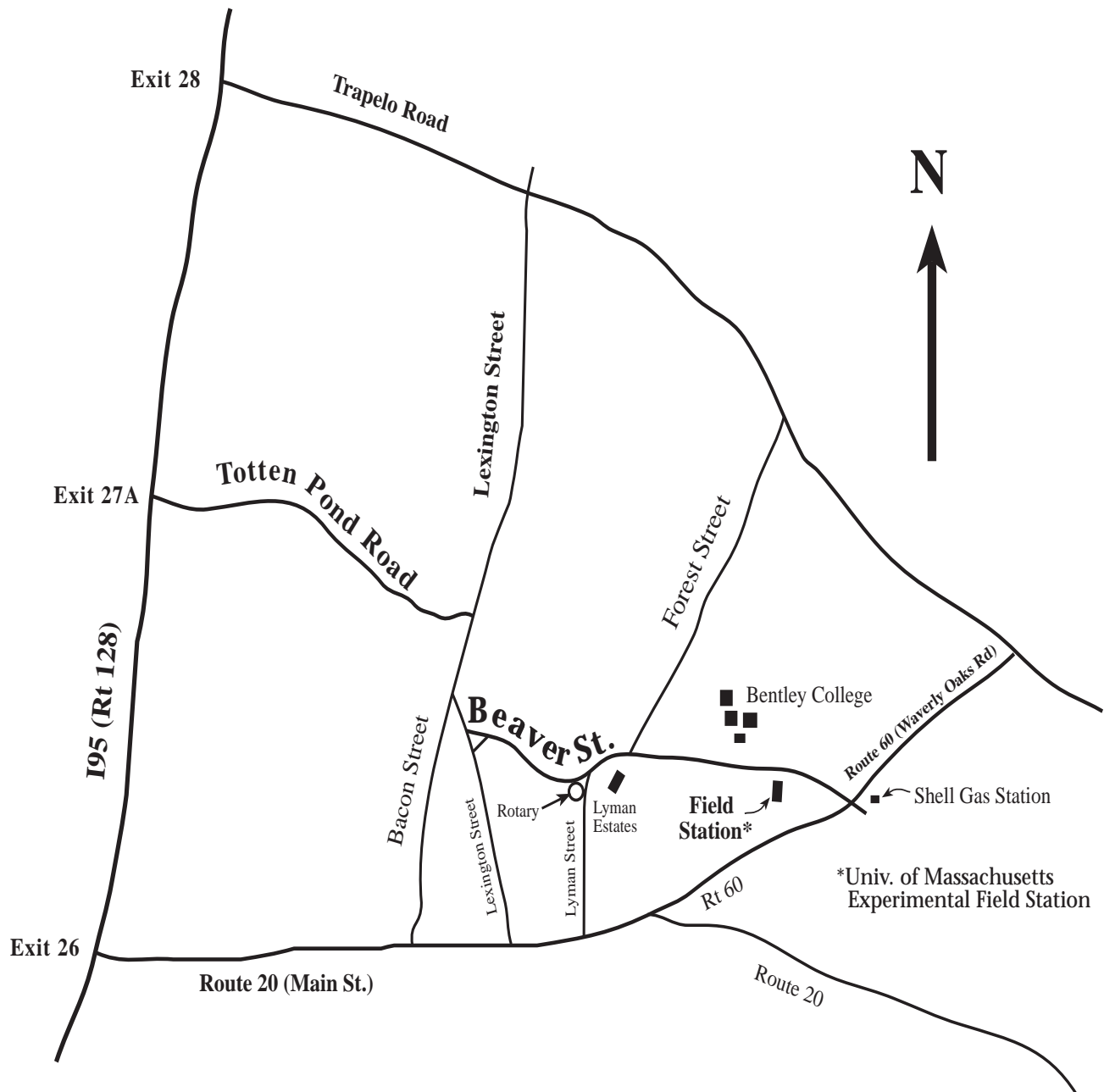

Directions to the University of Massachusetts Suburban Experimental Station:

From I-95 (Rt 128) take Route 20 (Exit 26 Main St.) east. Bear left on Route 60 (Waverly Oaks Road), then turn left on Beaver Street. The Field Station is approximately 1/8 mile on the left.

OR

From I-95 take Totten Pond Road (Exit 27A) East (right at lights) for 1.2 miles. At lights turn right onto Lexington St. At next lights (1/4 mile) turn left onto Beaver St. Go through rotary. Field Station is approximately 1 mile on the right.

From **downtown Boston**, take Route 20 (Main St.) west. Turn right on Route 60 (Waverly Oaks Road), then turn left on Beaver Street. The Field Station is approximately 1/8 mile on the left.

From **Rhode Island**, stay on I-95 (Route 128) at I-93 junction (BEAR LEFT).
