Vanda...the easy way

I simply love Vandas, but my lack of daily care proved they did not love me. Hanging Vanda coupled with daily waterings was a space and time comment I was not able to provide and subsequently I lost plant after plant until I finally gave up. In the words of MOS member Dr. Bob Hesse, I was a "serial killer".

In October 2014, MOS / NHOS enjoyed a weekend field trip to the Montreal Botanical Gardens. In addition to the amazing tour of the greenhouses and grounds, we were treated to a tour of the private orchid greenhouses. It was during that tour my vision of how to grow a Vanda changed forever.

There growing in POTS no media were Vanda. These Vanda were thriving. I saw Big Vanda, medium Vanda and small Vanda all green and all very happy. After carful investigation I discovered that many of the pots did have drainage, but not in the bottom of the pot rather up and inch or two, thereby allowing for water to collect, semi hydroponic if you will. Very interested in this method I approached the orchid greenhouse manager who confessed that he too had been troubled by the space and watering requirements so he had developed this method to keep them hydrated and contained.

Anxious to enjoy a similar success I adapted the MBG garden method to work in my Basement Greenhouse. I do not use pots but rather clear glass vases so that the roots can photosynthesize along with the leaves under my T-5 lights. I wrap the roots into a

bundle and place the Vanda into the top of the vase. The roots unravel and expand into the bottom of the vase. I usually mist the Vandas a twice a week allowing the water droplets to accumulate at the bottom of the vase. The roots continue to suck up the water and become a brilliant green. I never allow the water in the bottom to exceed more than a ½ inch deep. I find that the roots remain green and hydrated for several days before I must repeat the process. Using this method they all enjoy healthy hydrated roots and spike with blooms several times a year.

Now to my delight the Vandas that I love, love me back.
