After receiving his degree in biochemistry from the University of Toronto, Dave opted to step outside his chosen field and operated a tropical fish import business for eight years. Upon returning to school, Dave received a degree in enology and viticulture from Brock University in St. Catharines, Ontario. While attending Brock, Dave began acquiring orchids one 2" pot at a time and before he graduated, Dave had over 100 orchids. Winemaking and a passion for orchids prompted Dave to seek a warmer climate in California about one year later. Dave has been growing paphiopedilums for about 15 years and seriously hybridizing for the past 10 years. He is an accredited AOS judge and his paphiopedilums have received over 100 awards to date from the AOS and CSA. Many of those awarded plants play important roles in his breeding program. In 2018 Dave left winemaking in order to focus all his time running Paph Paradise Orchids.

When did you join MOS?

A southern bred orchid grower who joined the Society some 22 years ago, when my wife's work brought us to New England.

What got you interested in orchids and how long have you been growing?

I've been growing orchids of every genera for about 2 years longer than I've been in the Society.

What's in your orchid collection?

My focus in the orchid world is species Cattleya and Laelia. I have 10 different color forms of L. purpurata as well as over 100 plants of the same species that I bred myself.

Lately, as I run out of room in the greenhouse, I've started to collect several species of the Brazilian Rupiculous Laelias. I can fit a dozen of these plants in the footprint of 1 purpurata.

Other hobbies include: Training and hunting over Labrador Retrievers/ Deep sea fishing/ Hunting Invasive wild pigs in Southern Florida.

I also grow anywhere from 1500 to 2000 hot pepper plants covering about 15 different varietals on my farm in Virginia and I've been hybridizing Marigolds for about 10 years now.

What do you hope to bring to the Board?

I should be able to bring Corporate knowledge and an olde guy's perspective to the board in the same manner as I've tried to bring to the general meetings.

What got you interested in orchids and how long have you been growing?



I started growing orchids and other tropical plants in 2017. But my passion for plant life began as a child. 





