Another fun and interesting way to learn more about orchids and help the society is to clerk! Friday morning, American Orchid Society judges and volunteer clerks are going to be judging the show. Clerking involves walking around the show with the judges talking orchids and orchid displays for a few hours. You even get lunch afterwards! There are three types of clerks in addition to a general clerk: pointer, ribbon clerk, and head clerk. Pointers will walk ahead of the group and will look for the tags of the plants the judging team is judging (did I mention that folks are divided into groups with two or three judges and three or so clerks and that each group will be assigned a different tribe of orchids or

artwork to judge. Some tribes are small so groups may have a few different tribes). Pointers will often have a stick they use to, well, point. Ribbon clerks carefully put the ribbons on the winning plants. Head clerks keep an official copy of the winning plants.

To continue this busy month, our speaker for the November meeting will be Fred Clarke of Sunset Valley Orchids. Fred is known for his fantastic *Catasetum* and relatives as well as unbelievable *Paphs*, *Catts*, and many others! Really, check out the website www.sunsetvalleyorchids.com/. Monthly Meeting — Fred Clarke, Sunset Valley Orchids

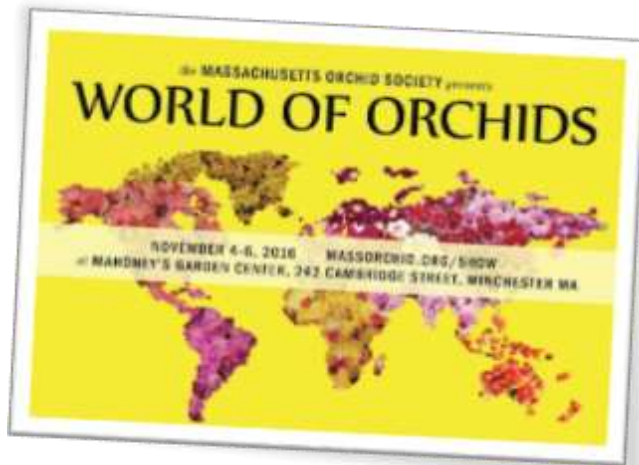
